Cobb EMC is consistently recognized for **competitive rates**, commitment to **renewable energy** and **giving back** to the communities it serves. Cobb EMC is one of the largest EMCs in the nation, and the company's wholly-owned subsidiary Gas South is a leading provider of natural gas in the Southeast.

As a not-for-profit, member-owned corporation, Cobb EMC is dedicated to providing members the **best service** at an **affordable price**. We strive to be a good corporate citizen and neighbor, as well as a recognized leader in the utility industry.

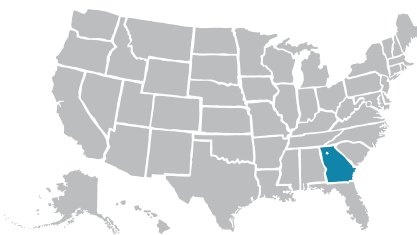

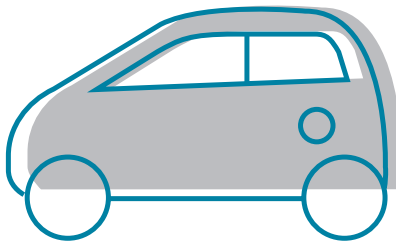

- Cobb EMC residential members' **bills are \$52 lower** per month than the average utility bill in the state among all reporting electric utilities.*
- Ranked the **most affordable electric utility** in Georgia with the **lowest rates in the state three years in a row.****
- Since January 2013, Cobb EMC has given back **\$86.1 million** in wholesale power adjustments to members.
- When we have a good year and earn profits or margins, we can give cash back to our members. Since 2018, Cobb EMC has given back **\$63.8 million** in capital credits.
- Our partnership with Gas South helps keep Cobb EMC strong by **returning its profits to Cobb EMC**, which helps **keep electric rates low and reliability solid.**
- Cobb EMC's investment grade rating of **A+ by Fitch Ratings** confirms the strong financial profile of the company.

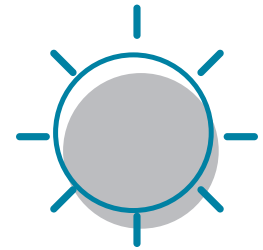
